# 3D faces

Students will learn about face parts, as well as other facial features.

What color of hair do you have?

What other facial features can you think of?



## Prep

## You will need:

1. Construction paper
2. Scissors
3. Glue
4. Coloring supplies



## Step 1

5 mins

## Introduction:

- Let's make a face craft.
- What parts of your face can you name?
- What color or hair does your friend have?

★ Did you know? Your lips don't have sweat glands



## Step 2

35 mins

## Activity:

1. Make the head: Cut a rectangle from pale orange construction paper. Fold the edges slightly and glue it onto another rectangle of construction paper of any color to form the head shape.
2. Add the features: cut out a small rectangle for the neck, a small strip for the nose, and small pieces for the ears from the pale orange construction paper.
3. Draw eyes, ears, and a mouth on construction paper, then cut them out and glue them onto the face.
4. Add Hair: Cut rectangles from construction paper and make slits to create a hair-like appearance.
5. Optional Details: If time allows, add additional details like earrings, a necklace, eyebrows, and cheeks to enhance the face.
